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HGSD Benchmark Availability Form

A benchmark is a survey mark that is a permanent disk, mark, rod, or pole that is placed in the ground or connected to a permanent structure with known positional information (i.e., latitude, longitude, and height). Use of a benchmark depends on the surveyor's ability to recover it in good condition. If a benchmark has been damaged, destroyed, or lost, its positional information may no longer be valid. In order to maintain up-to-date benchmark positional information, the Harris-Galveston Subsidence District (HGSD) requests that the public complete and submit this Benchmark Availability Form.
